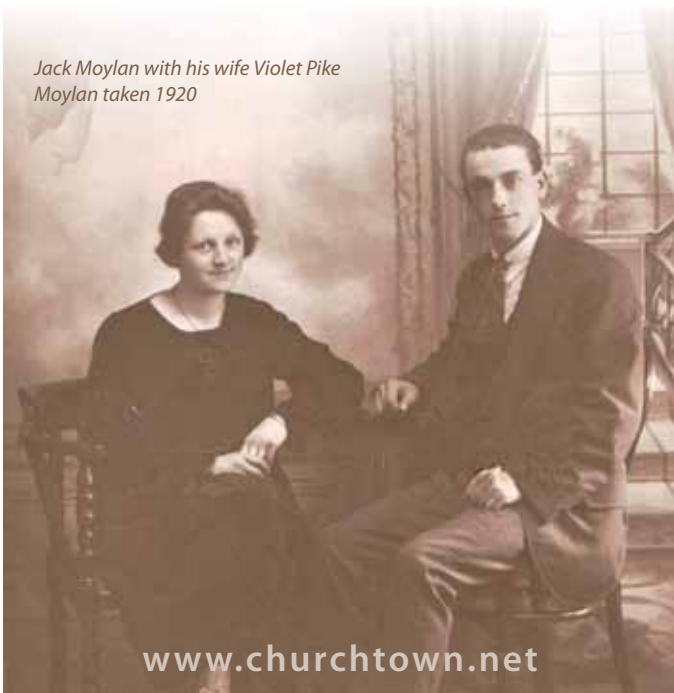

JACK MOYLAN

Jack Moylan (1898-1949) was champion Irish Flat Racing Jockey in 1926. Jack was raised at Egmont, Churchtown and in his early teens was apprenticed to English trainer P F Hartigan. A cavalryman in France in World War 1, he returned to Ireland and forged a successful partnership with Limerick trainer Ronnie Moss. His seven Irish Classic victories were 1,000 Guineas in 1926, 2,000 Guineas (dead-heat) in 1944, Irish Derby in 1944 and 1945, Oaks in 1944 and the St. Leger in 1939 and 1946. His major Churchtown-linked success came in 1938 when he steered Solford, trained at Clashganniv by Vincent O'Brien's father, Dan, to victory in the 1938 Cambridgeshire. Equally adept over fences he finished second and third aboard Fly Mask in successive Aintree Grand Nationals in 1924 and 1925.
