The name O'Keeffe is now back over the door though the pub is long closed. Some years after William died Margaret married John Murphy. The fiddle is inscribed with the name M J Cullinan and several interesting political slogans from the era.

Shandrum Céilí Band is led by Alan Finn from Buttevant and the multi talented band members include: Mairéad Fitzgibbon (Buttevant), Mikie O'Gorman (Boherbue), Eddie Kiely (Boherbue), Brian and Keith O'Loughlin (Corofin), Timmy Collins (Kiskeam), Tadgh O'Sullivan (Millstreet), Aileen O'Callaghan (Mallow) and Ger Naughton (Newtownshandrum).

The new Shandrum CD includes 15 tracks and a selection of over 30 tunes assembled into Reels, Quadrilles, Marches, Single Jigs, Jigs, Waltzes, Scottisches and Flings. Two tracks included in the CD that will undoubtedly become the definitive versions are The Walls of Liscarroll and The Rakes of Dromina.
